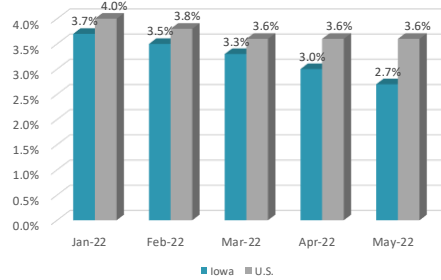

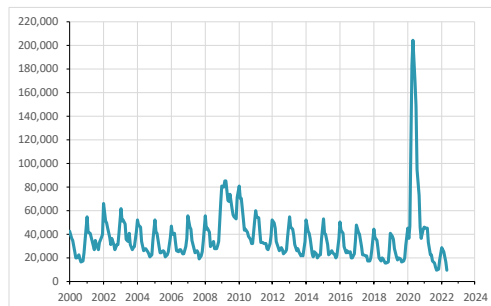

Iowa and U.S. Unemployment Rates –2022



- Iowa's unemployment rate dropped to 2.7 percent in May. The state's jobless rate was 4.5 percent one year ago.
- The state's total employment level increased to 1,657,200 in May from 1,646,800 in April.
- The U.S. unemployment rate remained at 3.6 percent in May.

Unemployment Insurance (UI) Recipients



The number of persons receiving at least one regular UI benefit payment during the month.

- The number of persons receiving at least one regular Unemployment Insurance benefit payment during May 2022 totaled 9,398. This represents a decrease of more than 50 percent from the May 2021 figure of 22,286.

- Iowa businesses shed 500 jobs since April. Although small, this loss is the second in the last three months.
- Construction shed the most jobs in May, paring 2,100 jobs. Most of the losses were specialty trade contractors. This is the first loss for this sector since October.
- Retail has started to trend down with losses over the past three months. This sector shed 800 jobs in May.
- Private education shed 700 jobs. This loss was more than usually expected as schools broke for summer.
- Financial activities added the most jobs in May (+1,300). This sector's growth was fueled by hiring in insurance and related activities.
- Manufacturing gained 1,000 jobs this month. All of the increase were within nondurable goods factories. This is now the sixth-consecutive increase for this sector.
- Over the past twelve months, Iowa establishments have added 34,900 jobs. The largest gains continue to be within leisure and hospitality (+12,300) and manufacturing (+8,100).
- Iowa has added back 151,100 jobs from the pandemic low reached in April 2020 and now trails March 2020 levels by 18,700.
